

28th International Conference of the World Association for the Advancement of Veterinary Parasitology

As part of the 26th International Conference of the World Association for the Advancement of Veterinary Parasitology, which took place in Kuala Lumpur earlier this month, a bidding committee travelled to present Ireland as a potential destination for the 28th WAAVP in 2021.



The Dublin bid was put together by the Local Committee in partnership with Keynote PCO, and provided a comprehensive approach to hosting the 28th WAAVP 2021 at the Convention Centre Dublin. The bid was supported by Fáilte Ireland, Meet in Ireland and Dublin Convention Bureau through the Conference Ambassador Programme.
